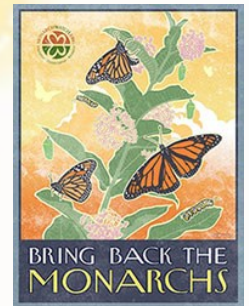
Blooms and Pollinators
