Forest Park Arboretum

Forest Park Arboretum, which embodies over 100 different species of primarily native trees, shrubs, woodland areas, re-established prairie and a butterfly garden, was originally developed in the 1940's by Eugene Hastie, a farmer, local historian and author. The arboretum was planted in straight lines to allow farming between the rows of growing trees.

Mr. Hastie's love of history prompted many local residents to donate artifacts to his existing private collection. Forest Park Museum portrays the history of Dallas County. It opened to the public in 1953.

Our museum is among the finest small museums in the state. Displays include early transportation, farm machinery, small hand tools, railroading, a blacksmith shop and much more.
