


1 Forest Park Museum

14581 K Avenue, Perry, IA 50220



The museum exhibits natural, cultural, and historical artifacts of central Iowa. Displays include early transportation, farming, railroading, wildlife, blacksmithing, local artists, genealogical references, and library resources, plus the Alton School House, the 1860s Grabenhorst log cabin, and nearly 20 acres of arboretum park and restored prairie. Open weekdays year-round (weekends April—October). Free admission.

5 Voas Nature Area

19286 Lexington Road, Minburn, IA 50322



This 700-acre area includes restored prairie, wetland, and oak and hickory forest and has miles of trail for hiking or skiing. Nearly half the property is wildlife refuge, and 330 acres are a public hunting area and 100 acres are designated a Youth Hunting Area (permit required). The Voas geologic museum is open for programs and by appointment.

16 G.A.R. Post Historical Site

1213 Thomas Street, Redfield, IA 50322



Built in the early 1880s by the Sons of Union Veterans, the Grand Army of the Republic Post has been restored as a history museum that is open by appointment. It is the last "Country Post" still standing in Iowa.

14 Kuehn Conservation Area

32828 Houston Trail, Earlham, IA 50072



This 780-acre property showcases a variety of habitats from native and restored prairies to riparian and upland forests. An impressive network of hiking trails leads visitors

throughout the property, while the South Raccoon River Water Trail winds along the eastern border. Kuehn includes a wildlife refuge, 2 primitive camping areas, a bird blind, and modern restroom facilities in the education building. Hunting is allowed in sections of the conservation area, including a bow hunting only unit.

17 Hanging Rock

916 Redfield Street, Redfield, IA 50233



Along the Middle Raccoon River, the park's namesake outcrop of sandstone has been used as a major landmark for years. The 469 acres of conservation land includes prairie, savanna, wetland, and riparian areas. The north section is a wildlife refuge and developed park with picnic shelter, astronomical rock clock, and a spur of the Raccoon River Valley Trail. Portions of the southern section are open to hunting. No camping allowed.

2 Sportsman Park

13821 130th Street, Dawson, IA 50066



With 40 acres of oak and hickory forest overlooking the North Raccoon River, this park is a lovely area for camping, fishing, hiking the nature trails, picnicking, or playing on the accessible playground. It's a very short distance off the Raccoon River Valley Trail and is a popular overnight stay with trail users. Two all-season cabins can be reserved for overnight rentals throughout the year. Modern and primitive campsites are also available from April—November. A 120-person lodge can be reserved for day-use.

13 Glissman Conservation Area

32185 Panther Creek, Adel, IA 50003



Glissman includes a 7.5-acre pond and 60 acres for hiking, fishing, birding, picnicking, or mushroom hunting. The lodge sleeps up to 8 people and features a fully equipped kitchen, 2 bathrooms, 1 ADA shower, and a deck with beautiful panoramic views. Linens not furnished. Open April—November.

9 Raccoon River Valley Trail

20 High Trestle Trail



These two iconic multiuse trails will eventually connect in Perry. The 89-mile Raccoon River Valley Trail travels through many Dallas, Greene, and Guthrie County communities (RRVT permit required) and includes a 72-mile loop. Named for a dramatic 13-story bridge spanning the Des Moines River, the High Trestle Trail runs in Polk, Story, Boone, and Dallas Counties.

21 Dayton Stagecoach Inn

14750 Pecos Court, Bouton, IA 50039



Originally constructed in 1868, this restored inn sits on 10 acres south of Bouton. It can sleep up to 9 people and includes a fully equipped kitchen, dining room, multiple sitting rooms, plus an outdoor deck, picnic table, and fire ring. It can be reserved from April—November and is a short drive to area attractions including Forest Park Museum and the High Trestle and Raccoon River Valley Trails.
